

PMBC Adoption Working Group - Working Session #7 Summary Notes Mar 13, 2018 – 10:00am to 12:00pm – Web Meeting

Session Summary and Action Items:

ParcelMap BC Operations

1. Budget has been approved for mapping of “hard” AFB conversions and back-capture of historical Foreshore Parcels.

Adopter News

1. City of Penticton now fully adopted. Total of 10 organisations now fully adopted.
2. ALC expected to transition to using ParcelMap BC as the basis for ALR boundary alignment by the end of March.
3. BC Assessment is continuing to fine tune the process for the assessment fabric to match PMBC geometry. This will likely be complete by the end of March.

Outreach & Awareness

Adoption Toolkits

1. The revised PMBC product description is considered a significant improvement over the previous version, particularly for non-technical users. The current documentation would benefit from the inclusion of a diagram showing the tables / schema and the relationships between tables.
 - a. Action Item: LTSA to include a diagram (Visio) showing PMBC tables and relationships as part of the product documentation. – **LTSA**
2. AWG members expressed the desire to have documentation provided via a “wiki” style presentation. The ability to download or print sections as needed was also requested.
 - a. Action Item: Communicate requirements related to presentation of PMBC documentation to LTSA’s web development team – **LTSA**
3. A Land Records Cross Reference is being developed jointly by some AWG members to assist in maintaining mapping between PMBC and Tempest. The outputs of this are expected to be of benefit to other adopter organisations that have Tempest.

- a. Action Item: Continue work on the PMBC / Tempest Land Records Cross Reference and share with AWG when ready. – **Brian Goble / Vanessa Pocock / Jason Hart**
4. Esri Canada are continuing to work on developing tools and materials related to supporting PMBC related workflows and are eager to work with adopter organisations to deploy these resources.
 - a. Action Item: Continue to develop resources related to PMBC workflows and communicate with AWG as resources are developed and made available. – **Esri Canada**

AWG News

1. AWG Peer Ambassadors are required to augment the reach of the AWG Facilitation Team (LTSA & ICI Society). Invitations to participate as an AWG Peer Ambassador will be extended to AWG members.
 - a. Action Item: LTSA to extend another invitation for AWG members to participate as AWG Peer Ambassadors. – **LTSA**
 - b. Action Item: Each AWG organisation to identify a primary contact (ambassador) and inform LTSA (Brian Greening) who their representative is. – **All AWG member organisations**
 2. Urban Systems have expressed an interest in participating in the AWG as a vendor. Due to the large volume of work they do (particularly in the interior and northern BC their participation would be considered an asset to the AWG.
 - a. Action Item: Invite Urban Systems to participate in the AWG. – **ICI Society**
 3. A future AWG working session will focus on what LTSA offers (e.g. products and services beyond PMBC). This is likely to occur for the May AWG session.
