PMBC Adoption Working Group - Working Session #9 Summary Notes May 15, 2018 – 10:30am to 2:30pm – In Person

Summary of Key Session Findings / Outcomes:

- 1. <u>New AWG Members:</u> Kristi Smith (Port Moody) and Mercedes Braun (Urban Systems) have joined the AWG.
- <u>"Housekeeping"</u>: The ParcelMap BC home page is undergoing a series of updates. A new support email address has been created to serve as a focal point for all PMBC related inquiries: <u>ParcelMapBC@ltsa.ca</u>.
- 3. <u>ParcelMap BC Operations</u>: Maintaining under 2 day turnaround on updates. The latest spatial improvement assessment was performed May 1st and published May 9th.
- <u>Adoption Status Update:</u> 14 organisations have now adopted ParcelMap BC. 4 new local governments have reached the "adopted" status since the March AWG meeting. More adopters are moving to the "assessing" stage – this is partially due to the positive impact of the ongoing 360 labs being conducted by ICI Society.
- 5. <u>BCA Status:</u> BC Assessment has stopped updating other data sources 50 jurisdictions now using PMBC is primary parcel fabric.
- 6. <u>Esri Canada Support for PMBC Adoption</u>: Esri Canada demonstrated a number of workflows, techniques and tools to support the process of initial alignment of data sets to PMBC and maintaining ongoing alignment after PMBC updates. These resources form an 80% solution for stakeholders: additional refinement and vetting of these resources should be done in the form of a "lab" facilitated by Esri Canada to determine how to best apply these resources in each stakeholder situation using real client data.

The resources developed to date will be refined based on feedback from the AWG group. The tools demonstrated are expected to ultimately be made available to adopter organisations using ArcGIS tools; however, they require training and professional services support to ensure they are applied properly.

- <u>PMBC / Tempest Land Records Cross Reference</u>: The Tempest Land Records Integration AWG subgroup ("Team Tempest") has developed an approach to build a look up table to link Tempest data with PMBC. The process is currently manual and achieves approximately a 95% match rate. Parcels that are not matching currently are generally parcels without a PID. Work is ongoing to improve the match rate.
- 8. <u>AWG Backline SMEs (formerly "Peer Ambassadors")</u>: The concept of AWG Peer Ambassadors has been refined such that the AWG Facilitation Team will field all initial inquiries from stakeholders and direct the inquiry to appropriate AWG SMEs as required. The next step in this process is to identify willing AWG members and define the PMBC related domain(s) they are considered the expert(s) in.
- 9. <u>Focus of Future AWG Sessions:</u> Next AWG workshop in June will focus on Data Cleaning Practices in LTSA FabOps & the ParcelMap BC Adoption Issues Log.
